

Music Development Plans.

Notes from CPD meeting for Primary School teachers.

Monday 13th November2023. Led by Nicola Rose.

- The Department for Education recommended that schools have Music Development Plans in their document, 'The power of music to change lives' (June 2022). This is a recommendation and is not statutory: <u>The power of music to change lives - A National Plan</u> <u>for Music Education (publishing.service.gov.uk)</u> 'In partnership with their Music Hub, we would like every school (including multi academy trusts) to have a Music Development Plan that captures the curricular and co-curricular offer and sets out how it will be staffed and funded'.
- It is suggested that you describe what your school does at the moment in terms of curriculum, co-curriculum and enrichment. <u>Curricular</u> (National Curriculum and Early Years content. This should include your KS2 whole class instrumental provision eg WCET in year 4). <u>Co-curricular</u> (small group instrumental lessons, including continuation from WCET year 4). <u>Enrichment</u> (attendance at festivals, visiting groups performing to children etc).
- The self-evaluation toolkit produced by Devon and Torbay allows schools to judge how they are doing in four areas: classroom; beyond the classroom; leadership and management; community and partnerships. <u>Microsoft Word - FINAL Music Development Plan, self-</u><u>evaluation tool for schools (musiceducationhub.org)</u>
- Please check if your school, trust or academy chain has a template for school development plans before you start working on it.
